I. Purpose

To outline the MICHild Administration process.

II. Policy

In accordance with the contract with Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), Southwest Michigan Behavioral Health (SWMBH) will provide a standardized assessment process to determine eligibility for services for MICHild clients. Services covered include outpatient, residential, inpatient substance abuse treatment and lab/pharmacy. SWMBH will account separately for any expenses related to MICHild enrollees and submit all appropriate data and financial reports accordingly.

III. Standards and Guidelines

- A. The Access Center or participant Community Mental Health (CMH) and contracted providers will use a standardized assessment process, which includes ASAM patient placement criteria, to determine clinical and medically necessary services for MICHild eligible individuals.
- B. SWMBH shall cover substance abuse services provided through outpatient, residential, inpatient and laboratory/pharmacy treatment. SWMBH will authorize the least restrictive and most cost effective services that meet the MICHild eligible individual's needs.
- C. The Access Center, as part of its authorization process, will ensure that accurate, current demographic data and MICHild insurance information are maintained in the electronic database.
- D. Treatment providers will ensure that MICHild eligibility is coded accurately on the electronically supported database, which includes the individual's admission/discharge data, and that all encounter data is accurately coded to indicate MICHild insurance
