Training Description

This workshop identifies strategies for identifying and responding to human trafficking focusing on the vulnerabilities of potential victims and the response from those who encounter victims of labor and sexual exploitation. The challenges of working in anti-trafficking efforts are presented with the necessity of collaboration and connection occurring.

Training Objectives

- Define the specific Human Trafficking federal and state laws that also assist in the identification of victims
- Raise awareness about the intentional exploitation of vulnerable individuals or circumstances
- Inform therapists that human trafficking is a health care issue and may be the emerging model of responsibility
- Help assess clinical manifestations indicators that may lead to identification of either sexual or labor exploitation
- Identify factors involving victims based on practice-based evidence, that information is evolving based on study and research starting to become available
- Inform therapists of potential “risk factors” that are seen in health effects of human trafficking
