Worthwhile reading:

How important is it to dispose of unused meds?

"Properly disposing unused and unwanted medications helps protect the environment. It also helps protect our community against prescription abuse, addiction, and accidental or intentional overdose."

- High Household availability of medication is one of the contributing factors to the Opioid Epidemic in the US. Meds can be diverted, misused and taken in ways they were not intended for, by someone in your own home. Dispose of unused, unwanted and expired meds! (ONDCP/DEA/White House)
- Total # of opioid pain killers dispensed to residents of SWMBH Counties through Pharmacies in 2016: 8.75 million scripts (prescriptions) for a total of 610 million units (i.e. pills, etc.) Data Source: MAPS
- Average # of prescribed opioid pain killers meds per household in the 8 counties of the SWMBH area in 2016: 152 units (i.e. pills, etc.) Data Source: MAPS
- Quantity of unused/expired/unwanted meds collected in 2017 through the SWMBH year-round Med Collection Program: 15,488.40 lbs.

Ideas to help you protect your family and ensure household meds are not being stolen or misused:

What to do to restrict access to medication you have at home & protect your family from medication abuse/misuse:



- 1. Lock or secure all meds in your home to ensure that they will never be abused, misused, stolen, or tampered with.
- 2. Get rid of expired, unwanted, and unused medications
- 3. Safeguard all medicines that have to remain at home by monitoring quantities and controlling access.
- 4. Take inventory by writing down the names and amounts of medications you currently have and regularly check to see if anything is missing.
- 5. If your child is on prescribed medication, monitor the dosages and refills. Set clear rules, such as, not sharing and always following proper dosages.
- 6. Warn your youngsters that taking prescription or OTC drugs without a doctor's supervision can be just as dangerous and potentially lethal as taking street drugs.
- 7. Supervise your child's Internet use: many pharmacy sites are not regulated and will sell your child medications without prescriptions.
- 8. Only take meds that are prescribed to you.
- 9. Properly dispose of old, expired or unused medicines (see disposal locations list above)
