Training Objectives

- Develop a plan to incorporate small supervision and practice changes to impact inclusion of diverse student, client, and worker groups into social work practice.
- Demonstrate methods to resolve ethical dilemmas that involve more than one ethical imperative.
- Learn and practice screening strategies, and key points to collaborate with consumers, prescribers, and other treatment providers to assess and lower risk of opiate related overdose deaths.
- Evaluate and implement non-pharmacological pain management strategies for individuals with behavioral health needs.
